Geo UERJ was first printed in 1997. Between 1995 and 2007, eighteen issues were published, twice a year, including original articles, book reviews and interviews. Its publication was interrupted between 2005 and 2006, and after that, we started to publish Geo UERJ in the electronic format only, with the aim to maximize the access to its articles to all the scholarly community. In the electronic format, Geo UERJ is focusing in the publication of original articles and book reviews. Interviews with recognized professionals in the field of Geography should be published eventually.

The frequency of publication will still be twice a year and the journal is receiving submissions in a continuous flow. We are counting on the collaboration of all the academics in the field Geography and we hope that Geo UERJ may stimulate new discussions and reflections in the field.

As a venue for the dissemination of scientificinformation, the journal aims: a) to publish original research articles with a critical review about discussions in the field of Geography and related fields, articles resulting from empirical, experimentalor conceptual research; b) to foster the exchange of academic practices and experiences ininstitutional, national or international levels; c) to advocate for and respect the pluralism of philosophic, political and scientific ideas.

Geo UERJ does not work with the publication of thematic dossiers and it is open to articles related to Geography and other fields. In order to improve the quality of Geo UERJ it is indexed in GeoDados, Latindex, Sumários,org, DiretórioLuso-Brasileiro, J4F, Diadorim, REDIB, Google Scholar, Clase, CENAGE, DOAJ, LivRe, OAJI, DRJI, ROAD, Journal Tocs and all its articles are screened with iThenticate in order to avoid plagiarism.

The current issue of Geo UERJ (n. 28 - 2016) contains articles regarding themes of urban space, with questions related to the real estate market, districts in small cities, second home, as well as

themes like SIG, reflections about place and identity, the teaching of Geography, market networks, Transamazônica way, the occupation of slopes, hydrologic modeling and the role of PRONAF.

We acknowledge the reviewers for their fundamental work to maintain the quality of Geo UERJ.
