Publicum Review releases its second issue of 2019 (volume 5), which consists of a special dossier dedicated to the recent debates on the effects of digitization on democracies. The special editors of this issue are Dr. Clara Iglesias Keller, fellow at the Leibniz-Institut für Medienforschung Hans-Bredow-Institut (Hamburg) and research associate at the Alexander von Humboldt Institute for Internet and Society (Berlin), and Edoardo Celeste, lecturer in Law at Dublin City University and Irish Research Council Scholar at University College Dublin. The unpublished studies that integrate this volume were presented at the "Future Visions for a Democratic Internet" Symposium, organized by our special editors.
