## Editorial for vol. 10-3 (2018)

The Journal of City Law, classified by MEC / CAPES as Qualis A1, Law and registered in the Web of Science, is pleased to inform all its readers that it has been classified as the 4th most important electronic journal of the country in the area of Law and as one of the 450 most important Ibero-American journals of all specialties, in the Ibero-America Journal Rankings index of Clarivate Analytics and REDIB. The new ranking incorporates a new methodology, since it not only focuses on the impact of scientific journals in the region, but also takes into account published articles. The initiative comes from the agreement of REDIB and Clarivate Analytics to consolidate a bibliographic information system that allows the generation of scientific and editorial quality indicators at the Ibero-American level.

We publish in this issue the article "Benvenuti danni punitivi .... o forse no!" By Professor Francesca Benatti, Professor of Comparative Private Law of the Università degli Studi di Padova - Italy. PhD in Comparative Private Law by the Università degli Studi di Pavia.

This article "Benvenuti danni punitivi .... o forse no!" deals with the importance of the recent judgment no. 16601/2017 of Sezioni Unite of the Supreme Court of Cassazione of Italy, which addressed the issue of recognition of decisions in Italy which exclude damage punishment, overcoming traditional orientation and providing guidance to the legislator for possible intervention. The article, after several considerations, concludes that the decision of Sezioni Unite is a key moment in a process that is probably only at the beginning, clarifies the debate and opens possible actions by the legislator. It is sensitive to balance, moderation and stands out as one of the best judgments on the subject, and not just in the Italian legal system. The solution to circumscribe the scope of recognition of punitive damages and to exclude their effective entry is acceptable. This shows that only when the judge does not want to be "sovereign", but applies the laws with punctual adherence to the system, there is a real and conscious evolution of the law.
